
Supporting institutions working at grassroots level in multiple areas

From the desk of CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER



We are proud to report to our donors that we were able to fulfil our goal of collecting \$397,551 of which we have donated \$ 386,903 to the neediest and marginalized communities in INDIA and East Africa for various causes. Joy of Helping is a nonprofit organization that works with 14 NGOs in INDIA and 3 NGOs in Kenya. We have been frequently visiting INDIA and Kenya to look after all the projects.

Especially in developing countries, many children are blind due to preventable and curable conditions. We have been working with two major hospitals to provide pediatric surgeries to eliminate blindness.

Cataract, a leading cause of blindness - Joy of Helping is working with lions hospital in Nairobi, Kisumu, and Zanzibar, providing funding for an average of 1000 cataract operations every year.

Joy of Helping has been providing nutritious breakfast and midday meals to 2000 Nairobi slums area primary school children five days a week. We are also planning to support more organizations in 2022.

Our goal is to collect and donate more than \$500,000 this year. 100% of donors' contributions go to the causes. We bear 100% of the management and admin costs.

Donors can select the causes, which is most dear to their heart(education, vocational training, rehabilitation of neglected children, healthcare for physically and mentally challenged).



Total Contribution from Joy of Helping 2021




Disaster Relief Covid 19






Elimination of blindness in East Africa

Pediatric Eye Operations



Vision impairment and blindness impede access to education, employment, and other opportunities. Children with vision impairment lose the opportunity for a brighter future that education provides.

Your support allows us to reach typically unreachable people, ensuring that every person in every household of our remote target villages is screened, counseled, and referred for further care by someone who lives and works in their own community.



Vision Centers

Joy of Helping has already established 5 vision centers in Bihar with Akhand Jyoti Eye hospital has been training marginalized and poor girls to become optometrists as employees to run vision centers.

Joy of Helping plans to fund more than 15 new vision centers, with the capacity to reach additional thousands of people to serve cataract and visually impaired patients in Bihar, Gujarat, and eastern India.

A Vision Center is a permanent, physical local center that is equipped to meet 80% of all eye care needs, and refer patients who require more advanced care to nearby hospitals. These Vision Centers also expand job opportunities for community members, thereby supporting economic growth.

The impact of having vision centers in the poorest state of India - Bihar with a large blind population is incredible.

So many of these people wouldn't have had the chance for a quality eye treatment without vision centers. These center built through Joy of Helping and Akhand Jyoti Eye Hospital could provide primary eye treatment to over thousands of patients between December 2020 to February 2022, despite the COVID-19 pandemic affecting our operations.

Joy of Helping's generous support has enabled the creation of a legacy of eye care in the area. 985 people were provided with free cataract operation and 1,094 people with the refractive error were dispensed low-cost eyeglasses from the center from December 2020 to February 2022 in one of the vision centers.

The Joy of helping to cure Black Fungus



HIGH-RESOLUTION ENDOSCOPIC CAMERA

WITH ACCESSORIES





During the COVID-19 pandemic, Mucomycosis- a fungal disease that attacks patients (also called black fungus) who have had COVID-19, was rampant.

The ENT department of (Vadodara and Rajkot General Hospital) is a tertiary care reference center with an attached Medical College in the city of Vadodara. And Rajkot as such, the department treats patients not only from Vadodara and Rajkot but across Gujarat. The department is recognized for endoscopic surgery across Gujarat. These cases are operated without an external incision in the nose, paranasal sinuses, base of the skull, and the airway.

This disease requires advanced and extensive surgeries on the nose, paranasal sinuses, eye, and brain. At present in the last month, we have treated more than 1400 cases. These are lifesaving surgeries we need to operate in an emergency with safety. This surgery can be safe only if a good endoscopic camera system is available.

Sudha Ji the founder of Nari Gunjan felt that Karate would give the Dalit girls more self-confidence and to fight for their rights and sexual abuses.

The results were outstanding, and the girls became so skilful that they won five gold and five silver medals at a competition in Gujarat, earning a trip to Japan to participate in the international martial arts championship karate-do federation.

Conducting one-year residential "Diploma in Basic Rural Technology (DBRT)" program.

The program is based on the philosophy of 'Learning while doing' in a real-life environment that integrates rural development and education.

This is a unique program is recognized by 'National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS)'. Joy of helping in the post-Covid scenario has taken up Skill development in basic rural technology as their new thrust area which facilitates the skilling and grooming of rural agriculture-based youth for employment and economic upliftment opportunities. This is a work-based education that enables the students to be gainfully employed, start their enterprises, develop innovative technologies & successfully commercialize.

Child Welfare

Prerana

Prerana Night care center (NCC) for children living in red light areas. Prerana works to end second-generation prostitution and protect women and children from the threat of human trafficking.

Prerana's Night Care Center (NCC) is a space created to ensure the safety and development of children living in the red-light areas. This program was initiated as a response to the needs of mothers in the sex trade to keep their children safe during the night. The NCC provides services such as – protected shelter, wholesome nutrition, education support, safe play options, safe sanitation options, opportunities for skill development, awareness sessions, and an overall platform for holistic personality development and growth. The health and medical services have a systematic process that includes a complete general health check-up, periodic follow-ups, and end-to-end support for the management of specific medical conditions.

Prerana has four NCCs which are near the red-light areas of Kamathipura (two NCCs), Falkland Road, and Vashi-Turbhe Stores.

Nari Gujan

Nari Gunjan has been working with children who are neglected and abandoned; this can mean reaching out with a caring hand for a baby that is unwanted, abandoned soon after its birth or a child of 2 or 3 years old left on a train or at a bus stand. Most of the unwanted children left on the roadside or in the Bush close to the road.

Nari Gunjan has been conducting this program with the approval and support of the social welfare department of Bihar.

Nari Gunjan has been involved with this program since 16.9.2016, and about 112 children have come into our home, and 40 have gone for adoption both national and international. About 50 children have been returned to their parents.

The child welfare committee of the district assigns the child to one of the children's home/adoption agency homes. Most of them are girls; from one day to a few months old.

Adopting Children to Provide a Better Life.

Lately, Nari Gunjan adopted, just oneday-old baby who survived a strangulation attempt, she was left on the roadside.

There were scratches on her neck and other bruises.

Nari Gunjan's immediate decision was to save her by hospitalizing to get the best care possible, baby girl was survived.

She was on a ventilator for about 12 days and returned home on the 20th day from the hospital. Everyone was so happy that she got her life back and she is doing okay. Her name is Ananya.

Nari Gunjan has adopted another little girl whose umbilical cord was not even cut. There were no signs of attempts to finish her off so she survived the shock and came home after

a week from the hospital. Her name is Deepa.

All the children who have gone into adoption are placed in good families with very loving and caring parents.

Joy of Helping is encouraging the young generation to participate.
